Local Organizations Donate to GAFCC

This year, GAFCC has received the support of several organizations. Each of them, though diverse in their respective mission, has gone above and beyond to show their commitment to community service.

WE CARE Fund is the Nassau County Bar Association and on September 13th they donated to GAFCC “to help defray some of the cost of providing services to struggling families.”

J. Jill, the well-known designer of women’s clothing is also a company who is “committed to the issues affecting disadvantaged women and children.” In an effort to continue “empowering women and helping them become self-sufficient”, the store in the local community donates clothing monthly to the Guardian Angel Resale Boutique.
